Our College is host to the Minnesota College Press Association on Friday and Saturday, November 7 and 8. We are still short of rooms, especially for the men. A fee of one dollar will be charged students who fail to take an examination as scheduled.

Students will be permitted to repeat subjects totaling not to exceed sixteen quarter hours on the two year or four year course.

Students should inquire in the Textbook Library for lost books. Articles which have been lost may be claimed in the Business Office.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. A student may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

All seniors who expect to graduate during the present school year or in the summer sessions of 1942 please register in the Placement Bureau in Room A at once. It is very important that the November graduates complete their registration in the Placement Bureau this week.
