ORGANIZATION AND METHODS FOR THE VACATION CHURCH SCHOOL - a ten-hour Standard Leadership Education Course, will meet in Room Q, April 10 and 11; 24 and 25; May 1 and 2 - Fridays, 3:00 - 4:00 p.m.; Saturdays, 8:30 - 11:00 a.m.

Course leader - Miss Elizabeth S. Hanson, Director of Weekday Church Schools and Children's Work, Minnesota Council of Religious Education, St. Paul.

Cost - 40¢ including registration and course guide book "How to Plan and Conduct a Vacation Church School".

Purpose: To train young people with an educational background in Vacation Church School techniques.

To help meet the need for trained leadership for Vacation Bible Schools.

To interest Christian youth in serving in Migrant Centers.

To find and give special guidance to young people who are interested in serving in this way or through Sunday School teaching in their home churches or in communities in which they may live.

This course is arranged at the request of leaders in the Protestant Evangelical denominations in Minnesota and with the cooperation of the St. Cloud State Teachers College. It is open to all Protestant students. Upon completion of this course the Minnesota Council of Religious Education will notify the student's pastor and his denominational executive, that he has taken such a course. A credit card, transferable to his own denominational leadership training program will be issued.

The course will include the purpose and opportunities for Christian education in the Vacation Church School, how to organize, promote and finance the school, a survey of the best in materials and course plans, and will help prospective teachers adapt these texts.

Advance registration: Register with Dean Garvey by April 8, 1942.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. A student may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

Students will be permitted to repeat subjects totaling not to exceed sixteen quarter hours on the two year or four year course.

Students who expect to graduate at the close of the spring quarter must make application for their diplomas in the Business Office with the Registrar not later than Friday, March 20.
